City of Newcastle is proposing the following:

Naming of 3 new public roads as part of 42 lot Torrens title subdivision in Elmore Vale.

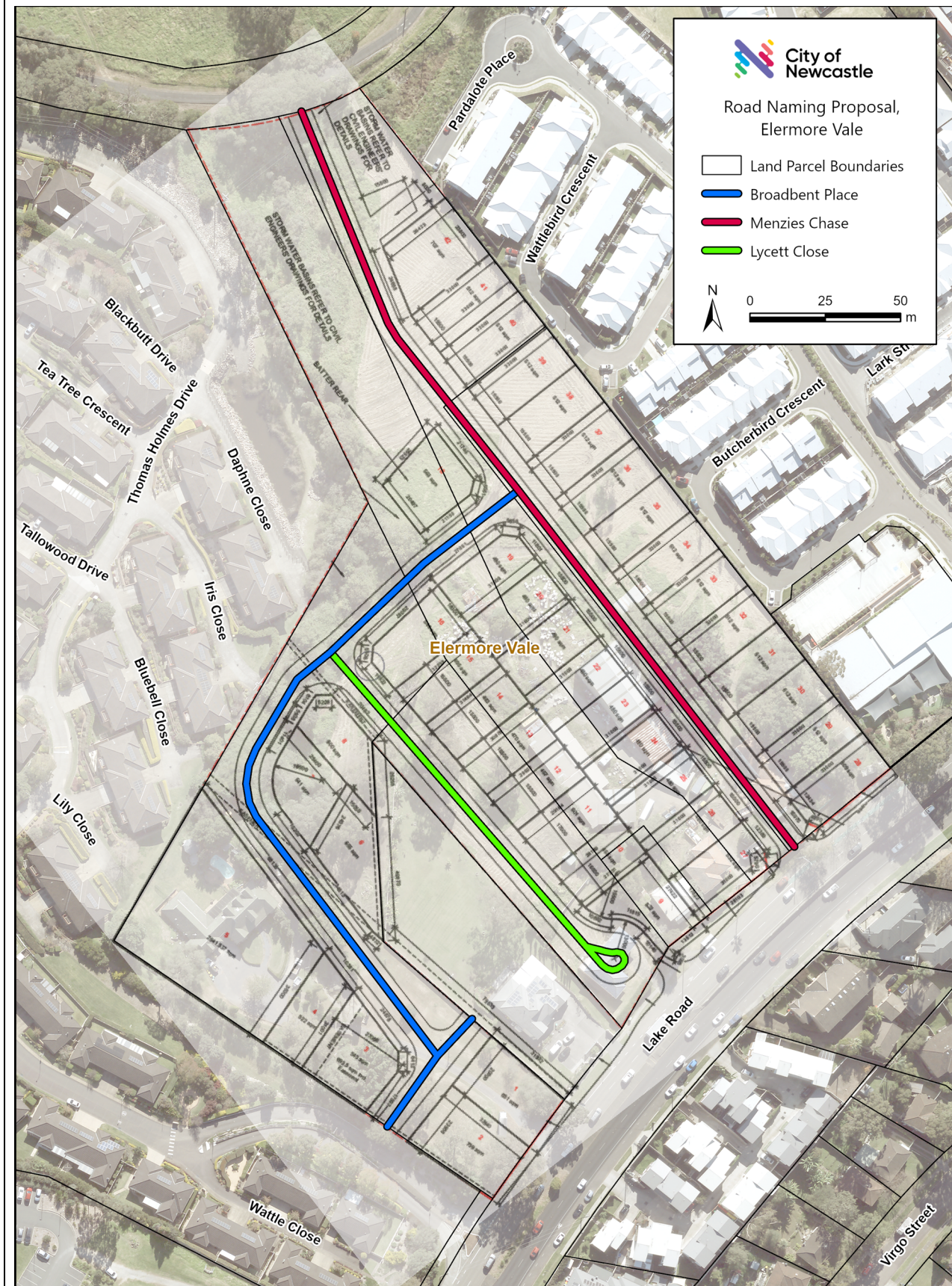
These roads need to be named to facilitate addressing allocation and to aid emergency service location and service delivery to the new lots.

The new names have been approved by the NSW Geographical Names Board. Members of the community are invited to view and make comment on the proposed road names.

Proposed Road Name	Suburb	Name Origin	Road Extent Description
Broadbent Place	Elmore Vale	The name commemorates James Broadbent, a convict worker who oversaw much of the coal mining work in the early settlement of Newcastle.	The road begins at its intersection with Menzies Chase and continues in a south-western direction for 141 metres, then in a south-eastern direction for 206 metres, before coming to an end in a T-shaped cul-de-sac.
Lycett Close	Elmore Vale	The name commemorates Joseph Lycett, a convict who was sent to Newcastle in 1815 for forgery. He was a talented artist who produced well-known paintings of the early settlement and landscape, including those depicting Indigenous life and culture.	The road begins at its intersection with Broadbent Place and continues in a south-eastern direction for 145 metres before coming to an end in a cul-de-sac.
Menzies Chase	Elmore Vale	The road name commemorates Sir Charles Menzies, a Royal Marines officer who was tasked with founding the settlement of Newcastle in 1804.	The road begins at its intersection with Lake Road and continues in a north-western direction for 296 metres before coming to an end.

Submissions

Any person, during the specified submission period, may make submissions to the City of Newcastle concerning the proposed road names. The submissions must specify:

- the grounds of support or objection.
- quote RN2024/00003 as the application number; and
- include the submitter's name, address, contact number and preferably an email address.

Please note: Submissions will only be considered that directly relate to the proposed road names. Any references to the approved development are unable to be considered as part of this road naming process.
