- 3.2 Strategic Focus Areas for 2023

The draft Cultural Precinct Masterplan on <u>CN's website</u> including Public Domain improvement, Museum Park, Civic Park, Wheeler Place, some streets and public areas in between to make the area more useable will be working with keys stakeholders and partners. Ideas for topics and guest speakers for meetings this year are most welcome.

4. Omega Ensemble

David Boyce briefed the Committee on <a>Omega Ensemble including:

- Omega Ensemble was founded in Sydney in 2005 by clarinettist and Artistic Director David Rowden. The Ensemble includes six core players and often expands to a chamber orchestra (15-20 players).
- Led by vision of uncovering 'Classical music for Contemporary Australia' to embrace and cherish the traditions of classical music.
- Supported through Create NSW, the box office and philanthropy.
- In 2020, Omega Ensemble introduced the Newcastle Concert Season with five performance planned at Newcastle Art Gallery. Following COVID disruptions, the Ensemble launched the 2021 Season as part of the inaugural New Annual Festival. Following a second year of disruptions, the Ensemble launched the 2022 Newcastle Season performing in Newcastle and completed all performances as planned.
- Challenges to continue to perform in Newcastle are venue availability and suitability for acoustic performance, promotional networks through venues and city and local investment for future sustainability.

5 Whale Chorus Theatre

Janie Gibson briefed the Committee on Whale Chorus including:

- A summary of her background travelling the world performing, teaching, producing and being a voice coach who returned to Newcastle during the pandemic.
- Janie read her vision statement.
- Janie is planning to produce large shows and develop emerging artists in the city (seeking funding and partnerships).
- Their presentation of Shakespeare Under The Stars performing *A Midsummer Night's Dream* at Pacific Park on 28 & 29 January supported by CN's Special Business Rate Program was a huge success with the inaugural season sold out one week prior.
- Funding has already been secured for next year.
- "Voices of Joan" is a solo performance of a feminist punk ritual looks at the history of misogyny. With written direction by Anu Almagro (of acclaimed Polish theatre company) to be here in July. Further details at link.
- Janice Musumeci advised she would be happy to introduce new people to the Business Industry Association board.



6 New Annual

Adrian Burnett briefed the Committee on New Annual including:

- Festival of art, culture and creativity runs for ten days from Friday 22 September to Sunday 1 October 2023.
- Strategic priorities are to:
 - o **Develop** CN's reputation as a world-class creative destination and drive event tourism
 - o **Showcase** Newcastle's unique businesses, venues, facilities, and natural environment
 - o **Acknowledge** and share the history and culture of our First Nations communities
 - Build capacity, strategic partnerships and audiences for local artists and arts organisations
 - o **Provide** new creative experiences to the people of the Hunter region and beyond
 - o Strive for inclusivity and accessibility in all activities
 - Commit to sustainable events practices
- New Annual was recently granted \$400,000 (\$200,000 per annum for 2023 and 2024) through the 'Stronger Together' grant program from Multicultural NSW.
- Total economic impact for 2022 was \$7,901,738
- Released EOI for Local Artists at <u>link</u> offering up to \$15,000 per project applications close 26 February.
- Festival Control Group and Project Working Group will be running this year aiming to have program finalised mid-April.

7 Come From Away

Delia O'Hara briefed the Committee on Civic Services and Come From Away.

8 Newcastle 500

The last Newcastle 500 event under the existing tripartite agreement with Destination NSW Supercars Australia will be held 10-12 March 2023. Council is committed to undertake extensive and broad community and stakeholder consultation in relation to the decision to extend the current agreement beyond 2023 under a plus five year option.

Newcastle Destination Management Plan

Newcastle Destination Management Plan 2021-2025 was unanimously endorsed by the elected Council in March 2021. The reimagined leisure destination proposition for Newcastle is Newcastle – Seek Off Beat campaign which continues to be rolled out and implemented.

In 2023, we enter the fourth year of the Covid-19 pandemic and if we look back at the immense challenges that have faced our community since 2020, it gives us even more reason to celebrate the strength and resilience of Novocastrians, none more so than in our arts and cultural sectors.

As Newcastle continues to gain renown as a city in which arts and cultural events, tourism and the visitor economy, along with education, health and research, become even more significant economic drivers, the pandemic is also a powerful reminder of how critical arts and culture are to us as humans. The desire to feel included, to be creative, to share experiences and foster opportunities run deep.

The Committee is proud to have successfully presented a new cultural framework - the Newcastle Cultural Precinct Masterplan which was developed following consultation with many cultural institutions, community groups and local businesses. It identifies the importance of key cultural projects such as the expansion of the Newcastle Art Gallery and the refurbishment of the Victoria Theatre, which, along with increased collaboration across institutions, will help unlock more than \$16 million in direct and indirect benefits to the local economy each year, including almost 35,000 additional visitor nights.

Collaboration between the Committee and other Newcastle cultural and community bodies continues to grow important links between local government and organisations that strive to improve the lives and experiences of all Novocastrians and visitors to our city. We are delighted that World Pride, in 2023 hosted by the City of Sydney, has chosen Newcastle as its only official regional event hub. We're grateful for the generosity of knowledge and experience shared with us by invited guests, including Janine Collins - the Director of Music In The Regions, and Lisa Colley - the City of Sydney Manager of Cultural Strategy. We not only learn from these links, but it creates even more opportunities for connection, inclusion and creativity.

I want to extend my thanks to each member of the Committee for their support and enthusiasm, each guest who has joined us, and the City of Newcastle staff who help make this work possible.
